Having read correspondence from the Appellant dated 28 October 2015 requesting a variation of the Tribunal Directions dated 28 September 2015 to have this appeal listed as a two day hearing and having read correspondence from the Respondent dated 4 November 2015 making representations on that issue but also raising a potential wish to adduce video evidence if no agreement can be reached between the parties on a particular issue in dispute

IT IS ORDERED AND DIRECTED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. In accordance with previous Directions of the Tribunal, the only witnesses who may give oral evidence are those who have provided written statements and who have been asked by the respective opposing party to be present for cross-examination only.
- 2. The Respondent has requested that Appellant and four of his witnesses be called for cross-examination.
- 3. The Appellant has requested that the three witnesses of the Respondent be called for cross-examination.
- 4. Neither party may call evidence in chief from its own witnesses nor may either party cross-examine its own witnesses.
- 5. This appeal remains listed for one day only with a strict commencement time of 9.30am.
- 6. The parties are directed to use their best endeavours to ensure that the hearing is completed within one day. The Tribunal will actively manage the hearing towards that end.
